## ***The Gettysburg Address***

***On June 1, 1865, Senator Charles Summer commented on what is now considered the most famous speech by President Abraham Lincoln, in his eulogy on the slain president, he called it a “monumental act” He said Lincoln was mistaken that “the world will little note, the Bostonian remark.” The world noted at once what he said, and will never cease to remember it. The battle itself was less important than the speech as follows,***

***Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought  
Fourth this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty,  
And dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.***

*Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who have gave their lives that this Nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do so. But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our pore power to add or detract. The world will little do not note, nor long remember what we say here, but can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us, that from these honored dead we take full measure of devotion, that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom and That government of the people, by the people, shall not perish from the Earth.*

*Herbert Clark Hoover: "Peace is not made at the council table or by treaties, but in the hearts of men." "A splendid store house of Liberty and freedom has been bequeathed to us by our forefathers. In this day of confusion, of peril to Liberty, our duty is to see that this storehouse is not robbed of its content." These are words borrowed from the essay of **(The Ultimate Betrayal)**.*

*Closing Annotation: The corporations listed along with our governmental leaders, have not a clue for these meaningful words, simply because, it isn't profitable to do so. Again, something went horribly wrong in our nation, because, neither our government nor the manipulative corporations of this essay have the respect for these meaningful words of truth under God.
